1.0 BACKGROUND

The Care Inspectorate's Board approved the current Reservation of Powers and Scheme of Delegation on 30 March 2017. The Board approved the Standing Orders in June 2015 and the Financial Regulations on 17 January 2018.

2.0 CONSULTATION

Consultation has principally been by way of reviews of the effectiveness of the Resources Committee and the Quality and Strategy Committee. In addition, at the Board Governance Review on 15 March, the Board agreed for proposals around a revised Board and Committee structure to be brought to the Board meeting in June.

3.0 PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

3.1 Reservation of Powers and Scheme of Delegation – Appendix 1

- **3.1.1** A summary of the proposed amendments are set out in Appendix 4.
- 3.1.2 The principal changes are:-
 - Paragraph 1.5 authorises the Chief Executive to act and thereafter report to the Board where action is taken in certain situations which would otherwise have been outwith their delegated powers. This is in place of the requirement for any such action to be ratified or homologated by the Board.
 - Reference to committees other than the Audit Committee has been removed.
 - Paragraph 2.7.10 gives power to the Chief Executive to make changes to established staffing without the approval of the Board subject to a maximum cost limit of £200k per annum.
 - The addition of paragraph 2.9 which specifies functions, relating to the Care Inspectorate as an employer, which are now functions of the Board.

3.2 Standing Orders – Appendix 2

- **3.2.1** A summary of the proposed amendments are set out in Appendix 5.
- **3.2.2** The principal changes reflect the Care Inspectorate's new Board and committee arrangements and also the necessary consequential amendments required to reflect the proposed changes to the Reservation of Powers and Scheme of Delegation.

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3.3 Financial Regulations

- **3.3.1** A summary of the proposed amendments is set out in paragraph 5.0 of the Version Control section of the Regulations.
- **3.3.2** The principal changes refer to the new Board and committee arrangements and also the necessary consequential amendments required to reflect the proposed changes to the Reservation of Powers and Scheme of Delegation. In particular:
 - Paragraph 3.3 has been redrafted to reflect the proposed change at paragraph 1.5.1 of the Reservation of Powers and Scheme of Delegation which removes the requirement for ratification/homologation by the Board in certain circumstances and replaces it with power to act and a duty to report at a later date

Paragraphs 4.2, 4.3 and 4.5 have been redrafted to reflect the proposed change at paragraph 2.7.10 of the Reservation of Powers and Scheme of Delegation which gives the Chief Executive power to make changes to the establishment without the approval of the Board but within certain financial parameters.
